The Pre-Assembly opens on Friday with a clergy/ friend lunch at Eureka Christian Church. Two workshops will take place on Friday afternoon from 2-5 p.m at 5 Points Washington, IL:

Cherilyn Williams, Vice President for Communication in the Office of General Minister and President for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) will be offering a workshop on "Disciple Identity" on Friday, October 10 from 2-5 p.m. at 5 Points.

Our Pro-Reconciliation/Anti-Racism Team will also offer a discussion group for those who have read "A Lesson Before Dying" by Ernest Gaines. (See related article)

Our first official all assembly opening/gathering will be at 6:00 p.m. with our banquet, which will feature the State of the Region Address, election of officers, honoring our CCIW Disciple(s) of Merit, and our congregations for mission and ministry.

At 7:30 p.m. we will begin our worship in the world class theater at 5 Points Washington. Our offering that evening, beyond Regional Assembly expenses will be going to Week of Compassion.

Hotel rooms have been arranged at two nearby hotels: The Sleep Inn of Washington and the Hampton Inn of East Peoria. Mention that you are with the Christian Church. Keynote Speaker at the 2014 Regional Assembly will be Rev. Dr. Frank A. Thomas. Thomas currently serves as Nettie Sweeney and Hugh Th. Miller Professor of Homiletics and Director of the Academy of Preaching and Celebration at Christian Theological Seminary of Indianapolis, Indiana. His newest book is the revised and updated version of *They Like to Never Quit Praisin' God: The Role of Celebration In Preaching*, considered by many to be a classic. *American Dream 2.0: A Christian Way Out of the Great Recession*, was released by Abingdon Press in August, 2012. *Preaching With Sacred Fire: An Anthology of African American Sermons*, 1750 to the Present, coedited by Martha Simmons, offers a rare view of the unheralded role of the African American preacher in American history. He is the CEO of Hope For Life International, Inc. which formerly published *The African American Pulpit*. Thomas also serves as a member of the International Board of Societas Homiletica. an international society of homiletic professors.

Thomas and his wife, Rev. Dr. Joyce Scott Thomas, earned their Certified Professional Coaching Certificates (CPC) from the Institute for Professional Excellence in Coaching. While they are equipped to coach corporate, executive, business, life, personal, or group, their most passionate areas are pastors, pastor's spouses, and coaching in the area of preaching.



Two years ago, the Pro-Reconciliation Anti-Racism Team encouraged us to read and discuss John Howard Griffin's Black Like Me. In this American classic, Howard, a privileged white Southern man, came to understand what it was like to be a black man in the 1950s in New Orleans. Last year, the Team asked us to look at the contributions of persons of color as we read The Beatitudes: From Slavery to Civil Rights by Carole Boston Weatherford. This year, the team has picked an equally challenging and provocative book by encouraging everyone to read and each congregation to read Ernest J. Gaines' A Lesson Before Dying: A Novel.

Set in a small Cajun community in the late 1940s this novel asks us to consider what it means to be human, to live and to die with dignity. It explores the consequences of important life choices as Grant struggles with what it means to stay or escape his surroundings by moving to another state. While set in the 1940s, Gaines' understanding of the human psyche asks us to engage with universally relevant questions. At the same time it gives us insights into the struggles of persons of color both historically and in our society today.

The Pro-Reconciliation Anti-Racism Team invites you to read *A Lesson Before Dying* and then join us at the Regional Assembly in October as we share our insights and lessons learned in reading this book at a Regional Book Club Discussion on Friday, October 10 in Washington, IL. The team will provide refreshments and leadership for a vigorous discussion of what are vital lessons to be learned before dying.
