A Year of Reverence: Dreams, Intentions, and Plans

Plans change. Last Fall, I wrote to tell you I would be on a sabbatical pilgrimage walking the "Camino de Santiago" across northern Spain. The plans had been in the works for a year. In preparation for the Camino I walked over 500 miles. My backpack was packed, tickets purchased, euros exchanged. My brother and I were ready to spend two months together after nearly 40 years of living our own separate lives. It was going to be rigorous and wonderful. We were so excited to be off on this adventure. Plans change.

Five days into the walk a nerve in my left leg became inflamed. I could not lift my foot. I rested for a couple days, tried to walk again and then made it worse with an ankle sprain. I had to come home. I spent several weeks resting, four weeks in physical therapy, many days swimming in the pool and finally my leg is better. Plans change.

As you can imagine, I was not happy about this. I had been dreaming about the Camino for about 18 years. The time I was able to experience on the Camino was life-changing. I received what I needed in unanticipated ways. And, plans changed.

In my free-time at home, I re-read a book that changed my life 18 years ago, The Awakened Heart by Gerald May. In the book, May talks about Dreams, Intentions and Plans. Dreams express our deep longings; our hearts desire. They open our vision and give us motivation. My dream in walking the Camino was to be alive again---after a great loss.

Intentions are our attempts to set direction to our dreams. They begin to focus our attention; to move us toward of our dreams. My intention was healing and wholeness. Every choice was made with that intention in mind. If I set off in this direction it will move me toward life again.

Plans are the strategies we work out, the specific steps we will take, concrete time-sensitive actions. May says that dreams and intentions are the two aspects where are most free. It is when we get to plans, even when they are incredibly specific, where we lack the most control. And, often we judge the dream by whether the plans come to fruition. In other words, if our plans don't work out we judge our dreams as wrong. May says that is not true. Our dreams are never wrong, but, our plans may have to change.

He invites us to spend more time with intentions; setting sacred intentions for our lives that are expressions of the deeper purpose (dream) of life. For May, the purpose of our lives is to "bear the beams of love." Love often surprises us; opens us to unexpected joy; nudges us to be flexible; calls us to be less concerned about efficiency and more concerned about each other. Love changes our plans.

I for one am grateful. The unexpected joy of dreaming of life again, intending toward healing and wholeness, is that I have found love again---I don't even care if it wasn't my plan. Grateful!

This year I invite you to join me in setting an intention of reverence; to seek in every moment to be open to the workings of God---who is love, in our lives, congregations and world.

Finally, we are preparing to jump into New Day 2016--- a congregational transformation process rooted in deep spiritual practice. (See related article) Maybe it is time for you to set an intention to let God change your life,

Greetings Upper Midwest and Illinois/Wisconsin Regions of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ)!

My name is Sarah Page Jones and I am one of the **NBA XPLOR** residents living in the Quad Cities. Over the last five months I have been blessed to be a part of this community here. I have learned so much about myself and about the world we are living in. It would not be possible for me to be here in this program if it wasn't for each individual here in this region! You guys rock!

During my ten months here I spend 30 hours each week at a local nonprofit, Braking Traffik and 6 hours at First Christian Church in Davenport, IA and Braking Traffik. In each of these settings, I am given opportunities to grow in my leadership skills and reflect on the work of social justice. At the church you can find me doing pretty much whatever they need me to do. I do things for the church such as help with Sunday school and youth groups to just helping out singing in the choir some Sundays. I also have helped out in the worship service on Sunday mornings. My housemates and I even lead our own special worship service one Sunday evening to express our own forms of worship that we bring to the table. In the coming months I am excited to start a special Children's Worship service that will be held during children's church time. I feel this is a crucial part to developing a love for church when transforming from a child into a youth and furthermore into a young adult. This is a time to start making children aware of why it is important for themselves to be in church not just because their parents are making them or its "just what my family does". I have a passion to keep our young people in church since so many of my generation have fallen away.

Braking Traffik a nonprofit that is dedicated to eradicating sex trafficking in the Quad City area of Iowa and Illinois. Through education, legislative advocacy and community partnerships, this organization is a mover and shaker in the community and states of Iowa and Illinois. One of the major projects that I am assigned to is Any Kid, Anywhere which is our school program. Each week I am in local area middle and high schools teaching youth about the dangers of human trafficking and why it exists and finally what they can do to help end the demand. If I would have had someone like this come talk to me while I was in high school, I would have been able to make some wiser decisions. With Braking Traffik I have had the chance to meet with local and state task forces that all have a common goal to end human trafficking. I have met with legislators about what they are doing about human trafficking and how we can join together and have a more collaborative effort when it comes to combating human trafficking.

We have been working with our local task force and the DHS (Department of Human Services) to have a training here in the Quad Cities to provide a multidisciplinary approach for Eastern lowa and Western Illinois. This training will be able to provide multidisciplinary professionals with the next step processes when identifying human trafficking. We feel a majority of the Quad Cities area has had the human trafficking 101 training they are ready for that next step training. If any of you are interested in attending this training, feel free to contact me at Braking Traffik at (563) 468-2381 and I would be glad to talk with you more about this training and get you some registration information. Braking Traffik is doing great work here in the Quad Cities and even throughout most of Eastern lows. I am excited to see what is in the future for this organization due to their continued efforts and diligent work.

On a more personal note being a part of this program has been so important to me and my future. Without XPLOR I would still be a bank teller in Appomattox, Virginia not happy with my job and not knowing what to do about it. This program has shown me that I can enjoy my job and I can make a difference! I can change the world one person at a time. My life has done a total 180-degree spin since I left my hometown. I had never lived away from home and here I was moving to lowa where I knew no one! I now could never see myself returning to my hometown. There is so much work to be done out here in the world and I needed to step away from my normal and what was comfortable to make me to see it. I am so glad I took this leap of faith and joined this program. Again I would like to thank each one of you because without your support of this program this all would not be possible. So thank you, thank you, thank you! You are true rock

stars!

Progress: In this first communication, we are pleased to inform you that the General Minister and President (GMP) Search Committee of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) has been approved by the General Board. With a sense of humbleness and gratitude for being called to this important task, the committee met from Jan. 15-17 in Dallas, Texas to begin the search process. During this two-day meeting, we prayed with each other for God's guidance, participated in Pro-Reconciliation/ Anti-Racism training, spent time building covenant with each other, and focused our energies in active listening and engagement. We established a timeline that will take us from writing the position description through interviews and final recommendation of our denomination's spiritual leader and Chief Executive Officer

Communication: It is important that we engage everyone in the church. Everyone – from the folks in the pews through the General Church. With this communication, we invite you to walk this journey with us. We have established a GMP Search Committee informational page which will serve as a way for you to communicate your thoughts and ideas with us. A questionnaire will be provided to solicit your input and we will be sending updates throughout our process. Stepping Into Stewardship Conference


