


DRIVE-IN CHURCH

PHASE I WCC | PHASE 3 RESTORE IL

- Continue holding online worship services only (WCC)
- Limit gatherings to those that can be held virtually (by remote viewing) for vulnerable populations and consider video streaming or drive-in options for services (CDC)
- Consider resuming recording in the sanctuary while maintaining 6 ft of space
- High risk individuals should continue to shelter in place

"Gatherings of 10 people or fewer are allowed"

SUPPLY LIST

(I) Short Range FM transmitter (Retekess TR501 FM Broadcast Transmitter, we bought older this is the link for the newer one which is the

- (1) 30FT. 1/4' cable (goes from keyboard to transmitter)
- (1) 1/4" female to 1/8" (3.5mm) male
- (I) Power strip
- (I) 100ft power cord
- (I) RØDE Go Wireless Microphone (we purchased from Best Buy. They had in-stock and we were able to pick up curbside that afternoon. It includes cable needed to plug into transmitter)
- (1) Tripod (we use this to still live stream worship)
- (I) iPhone/Android Device (we use this to still live stream worship)
- (I) Sign to tell people what station to tune to



WHAT VOLUNTEERS NEED PRIOR TO MAY 29TH

- (I) Music
- (I) Transmitter Runner/Parking Attendant
- (I) Worship Leader/Preacher/Parking Attendant
- All three of these come early and help set up and break down. It now takes us about 20-30 minutes to set up and 10-15 to breakdown.
- *All materials for worship, bulletin and music are mailed or emailed. People are asked to bring their own communion supplies

PHASE I OF WISCONSIN COUNCIL OF CHURCHES PLAN (PHASE 3 OF RESTORE ILLINOIS) VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO MAKE IT HAPPEN

- (I) music
- (I) transmitter runner/parking attendant
- (I) Preacher/Parking attendant
- (I) Worship Leader/Liturgist
- *All materials for worship, bulletin and music are mailed/emailed. Please are still asked to bring their own communion supplies

- Looking at conducting a drive-in church and looking at what options are best, and if anyone has used the short-range FM transmitter so members could listen in their car through the radio? What support options are available through the region?
- How do you do sound so everyone can hear?
- Have there been any sound system challenges, if so, what and how did you address them?
- What types of guidelines for staying in vehicles? I saw on the news a drive thru service and a few folks stood outside their cars.

- How are communion cups distributed?
- How is the offering collected?
- How many volunteers are needed?
- Do you offer any alternative for those members who are vulnerable to Covid 19 or considered at risk? Ex. Is the service live-streamed or conference call line available?
- Have you experienced inclement weather? I realize that the attendees are in their cars. What plan do you have in place to protect worship participants and equipment?
- How do you handle music?
