Regional Minister's Moment

Our mission; To connect and empower Disciples congregations for lifechanging and life-giving ministries in our evolving world.

Dear Church,

On Jan. 6, 2021, Epiphany in the Church year, I returned a phone call to my colleague Rev. Eugene James, Regional Minister for the Christian Church Michigan Region. He had asked me a few weeks earlier to consider partnering as the regional minister for Michigan when he retired at the end of 2021. I told him I would study the "Vision" and pray about it. On Jan. 6, I called to give him my answer, "I am willing to be in conversation."

It is ten months later, and it seems we are a world away from all that was happening that day. One thing was constant, we have continued in prayer and conversation. Both of our regional governing bodies have voted to be in covenant partnership---not a merger. At the September Michigan regional assembly, the delegates officially affirmed our path forward.

On Jan, 1, 2022, this covenant partnership begins. Here are two highlights for the beginning of 2022:

Sunday, Jan. 2 is Covenant Sunday. We have a team creating worship resources for you to use. There will be a brief video that humorously tells the story of our coming together. (This is not a merger!) The video concludes with a sermon from me based on Isaiah 42:9—

See, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them.

We will have and a litany of covenant and a written prayer from our General Minister and President, Rev. Terri Hord Owens for your bulletin. We are inviting Disciple congregations in Michigan, Illinois and Wisconsin to use these resources that first Sunday. It is our gift to our Pastors and worship leaders. You can just push play!

For now, plan to use the worship resources on Jan. 2. They will be up on our regional websites in November.

Monday, April 18- Wednesday, April 20, 2022. A joint clergy retreat at St. Francis Retreat Center in DeWitt, MI. Rev. Dr. David Anderson Hooker will be our guest presenter on Tuesday helping us to consider our stories within the narratives that shape us. This will be a time to create community with each other, relax, eat good food, play, and let down our cares.

As of now, CCIW will have three church vans/buses going from the north, central and south areas of our region. This will be valuable time away.

Updates:

We have called Rev. N. Alex Ruth to be our Associate Regional Minister for Transformation. He will have responsibility for the Lincoln Douglas, ROCC, Wabash, Lakeland and Southern Clusters. (See his bio in this Christian)

Hello Disciples in Illinois and Wisconsin!

I am excited to begin my ministry among you and to work with you as we strive to be the people, churches, and communities God is calling us to be. Early in November you can expect to see some opportunities to share your hopes, fears, concerns, and dreams about ministry in the years to come. We will be working to develop groups of congregations, clergy, and laity who will commit to support one another through the hard work of transformation. I want to take some time to introduce how I think about transformation for those of us in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). From our founding as a denomination Disciples have had two focal points for our life and ministry together; restoration and reformation. Restoration looks back at what has been – where we have seen God at work in our midst – and strives to recreate that energy and vitality. Reformation looks to the future – wondering what God is calling us toward – and leans into new ways of being God's beloved community in the world.

We tend to see these two ideas as mutually exclusive, as though we can look back **OR** forward, but never at the same time. However, the prophets of old show us that we can long for what has been and simultaneously long for what may be. This creative tension is one of the foundations of all transformation in our lives. We take the framework built by those who have gone before us and use it to build our futures as we grow and mature into who God is calling us to be. Sure, some of what we have done before is not helpful. It may even be hurtful. Yet, as we learn every year during Lent, the ashes of our grieving can become the soil of our flourishing. Together we can repurpose and reframe our faith in a way that honors what has been, even as we reach forward to what is to come.

I hope you will prayerfully listen for how God will call you to engage the work of transformation in your life, in your community of faith, and the community in which you live. Then, let's commit to faithfully working together as we follow the leading of the Spirit as we restore our hope and reform our lives, churches, and communities.

Clergy Bible Study (Registration is Open) Sermon on the Mount: The Law of the Gospel for a Multiracial, Interreligious World

Some refer to the Sermon on the Mount as the "life of uncompromising discipleship" (Dietrich Bonhoeffer) and "the highest instructions ever known" (His Holiness Shenouda III). It has inspired the mysticism and prophetic activism the Desert Mothers and Fathers, Hadewijch of Brabant, and Martin Luther King, Jr. It has compelled even for those who do not claim Christianity as their own, like Gandhi, al-Ghazzali, and others. As Matthew portrays it, the Sermon on the Mount is the "law" of the Gospel.
