I'm here. Finally. It seems like ages ago in the warmth of summertime when the Region gathered to celebrate Teresa's Ministry. We journeyed through two months of transition when the office Regional Minister was at least somewhat vacant (August was Teresa's vacation, followed by September when we had a period of waiting). We have finally turned the corner. I have spent the month of October drinking from a firehose of information while trying to attend every gathering of Disciples I can to meet the region. Gee Whiz, there sure are a lot of you to meet! I am thankful we have such a magnificent staff of servant leaders on this team that keep things running so smoothly.

So. I'm here. I guess I should introduce myself more fully. I'm Rev. Richard E. (Rick) Hamilton. Yes, please call me Rick. I have been in ministry for 30 years, having received my first Licensure (similar to Commissioning now) in 1993. More than half of those years were spent in Regional Ministry. I have served three other regions prior to coming to CCIW: While in Seminary at Brite Divinity School, I served the Southwest Region as Regional Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries; in 2001 I accepted a call to serve as the Associate Regional Minister of the Arkansas Region (three years later we merged with Louisiana and Mississippi to become the Great River Region; and more recently I served the Christian Church in Canada as the Regional Minister. I am a cradle Disciple and a fifth generation Disciple. I think it is safe to say I love the church and all of its people.

Now I am excited to say that I am meeting a new part of the body. I am a BIG believer in the importance of incarnational ministry. That is: I believe that being there matters. In a world filled with the efficiencies of Zoom meetings, I still believe in getting behind the wheel, driving to where the people are, shaking hands, sharing hugs, and spending quality face to face time together. So when I say "I'm here" I truly hope to be able to do so where YOU are one day.

Transformed Vision

He handed out gifts of apostle, prophet, evangelist, and pastor-teacher to train Christ's followers in skilled servant work, working within Christ's body, the church, until we're all moving rhythmically and easily with each other, efficient and graceful in response to God's Son, fully mature adults, fully developed within and without, fully alive like Christ.

Ephesians 4:11-13 - The Message (Emphasis mine)

God has transformed my eyesight over the past 20 years I've been in ministry. Not in a "healing the blind" kind of way. I still need corrective lenses to see with any clarity whatsoever. The transformation God has been patiently undertaking is how I see or understand the world and the things happening to and around me. Reflecting on this transformation, it has been going on much longer than my time in ministry. However, serving as a pastor has helped accelerate the process.

In my pre-pastoral life, I would say that most days, I didn't pay much attention to God or what God was doing in, through, and around me. I lived my life assuming that God existed, but the God I knew then was probably most like a High School Principal. You know they are around, but unless you are one of the few students who get to know the principal on good terms (student government, etc.), they are someone you don't want to visit. I wasn't one of those students who would have a good reason to see the principal in High School, nor was I one to be called into the office for disciplinary reasons. And that lifestyle continued through college and into the early years of my marriage with Jennie and starting a family. I knew God was there, but I certainly didn't want to get called into the divine "principal's office" for doing something wrong, and I really didn't have the desire to be a leader. After all, how could anyone expect God to use someone like me, with all my faults?

I don't know for sure, but I sense that most people live similarly. God shows up at our pep assemblies and calls us out of class when we've done something wrong. But that's about the extent of God's interaction with the world. Sure, we believe in God, know we are supposed to do good things, and hope that at the end of it all, we've made the grade and can walk the eternal graduation line and enter heaven.

When Jennie and I found a church home at First Christian in Lebanon, MO, we made some friends and began to get involved. But not "too" involved. We still didn't take on leadership positions during our time with Journey Christian Church in Lebanon, MO. That all started to change for me when I was introduced to a different way of thinking about God. For me, this happened with an event called "Camino." The best way I can describe Camino is a weekend church camp for adults, where participants are guided to experience God's grace in a powerful and transformational way. But, even after attending Camino and serving several weekends, God was still that detached principal in the sky.

Though my vision correction began with that experience, it was my involvement in the local church, the community of faith, that has enabled me to see the world differently and more clearly than before. A day doesn't go by where I don't see God working in my life and the lives of everyone I know. When a life ends too soon, I see God at work in the lives of the community. When there is a joy to celebrate, I see God working in the lives of the faithful. And when it is business as usual, I've begun to see the subtle ways God works for healing and restoration.

And I think that is due to my involvement with the church, with a community of faith. I believe it directly results from my willingness to answer "Yes" when asked to serve God. Most of you will not be asked to quit your job, go to seminary, or enter into full-time vocational ministry. But I hope and pray that you will take a leap of faith and seek out some way to be actively involved in a community of faith. And to consider if God might just be calling you to enroll in the School for Ministry and expand your capacity to serve and lead in the church. It is essential that we all listen to God, to truly and deeply pray about how we might engage our gifts, talents, and passions in serving God as we journey together.






Disciples Women's Fall Winter Retreat

Their colors are expressed in hues for which I don't know the words and in patterns which have never existed before and will never exist again. Their beauty and seasonal witness remind me of how all that we do has been accomplished here this year. It isn't because of paid staff alone, but instead the faithful service of many. As of writing this, in 2023 we have had 3600 hours dedicated to caring for this sacred space by over 100 different volunteers. People from all walks of life, with varying gifts, and from many faith backgrounds have given of what they can so others can experience God in this place.

We also celebrate as the year closes the other ways we've lived into our shared faith. We are caring for God's Planet, our Common Home, with a new solar array, by using goats to eat invasive species to strengthen our biodiversity, and by continuing to compost and grow in our garden. We lived into the radical hospitality we know through Christ with service for youth summer campers, family reunions, fishing trips, weekend gatherings, spiritual retreats, and more. Yet still, even when we did not accomplish everything we wanted this year and had some failures, we continued to grow amidst our stumbles and often because of them.

As we look forward to our future, we are excited for the seeds we are planting. We have wonderful plans for our facilities, the ecosystems we care for, and the programmatics we host. While they have yet to fully take shape, we see a future that is securely rooted in our history and our shared faith while branching into places we have yet to go. 
SCHOOL FOR MINISTRY Rev. Dr. April Stewart-McClure
